Club Membership is \$60 annually. The Club requires that members volunteer to help with work projects from time to time. Members must also join the Academy of Model Aeronautics, (the Iowa City Aerohawks are AMA Chapter 824). Flying members must also have a valid FAA UAS Registration Certificate, and must complete the AMA TRUST Certification process.

ANNOUNCEMENTS (formerly known as old business):



- 3. The indoor winter Sunday afternoon flying has begun in Lone Tree and will continue through March. Club members can still join in by paying a \$25. fee for the season.


NEW BUSINESS:

- 1. A review of our effort to find a new flying site was presented and then followed reports of recent contacts made to further our cause. Bruce Gardner said that Johnson County Public Works would not grant our request to establish a field on the acreage on the Eastside of Johnson county until the Johnson County Land Management presented a plan for the complete use of this land which they are unable to do in the near future. A suggestion was made by Katherine Staniforth that we check with a realtor experienced with commercial land sales to see if there is knowledge about land currently for sale or rent that we might be able to lease as a flying field. Bruce Fischer who is acquainted with Jeff Edberg volunteered to check with him to find out if he might have suggestions for us.
- 2. Bruce Fischer reported that plans of the January 25, Swap N/eet are proceeding as expected. The immediate need is to complete the recruitment of volunteers to fill jobs on the day of the swap meet. The list of jobs will be rerun in the next newsletter with a request for volunteers to sign up. Seven more people are needed.
- 3. The slate of officer for next year as presented in the November newsletter was set before the club for election. Gary Bernabe made a motion to accept the list and Bruce Gardner made the second. The new slate of officers was voted into office.

A motion was made by Bruce Gardner and given a second by Gary Bernabe to adjourn the meeting. A vote of affirmation produced adjournment.
