Our next clean-up effort is currently scheduled for Saturday, April 5th. The club will gather at 8:15 a.m. for juice and donuts at the clubhouse before heading out in small groups at 8:45a.m. to be in place by 9:00a.m.,

so we can round up all the wayward trash collecting in

Club Membership is \$60 annually. The Club requires that members volunteer to help with work projects from time to time. Members must also join the Academy of Model Aeronautics, (the Iowa City Aerohawks are AMA Chapter 824). Flying members must also have a valid FAA UAS Registration Certificate, and must complete the AMA TRUST Certification process. The Club has an active, free instructional program for beginners. - Invited to provide a static display of aircraft at Iowa City Optimist Club on Sunday, August 24th. Do we want to do it again" Attendance was poor last year, but club is interested in continuing. Can bring anything R/C, good advertisement for cub. Decision made by group consensus to continue this year.
- Removal of email addresses from newsletter necessary to minimize scam emails to club officers.
- Iowa City Aerohawks have been a non-profit in Iowa City since 1983. This is specific to Iowa City. Do we have a goal of being a federal non-profit? Not necessarily. We have an EIN (Employee Identification Number).

Old Business

- 1. New Airfield Search. Contacted AMA as they have a Field Location Assistance Department. Club's best bet s to attend a City Council meeting. But before we do that, we need to gather some information so that we can "sell ourselves", frame it as a loss to the city if we leave.
 - * Pull numbers regarding our events: rough attendance, vendors, approximate income. How much money we have spent on improving the land at the Landfill. Did Iowa City ask the Aerohawks to move to the Landfill site so the city could repurpose the land for public use? It was a joint agreement, as the prior location was at the airport.
 - Make a lit of community impacts. (Send to Bryce). STEM events, Museum donations/involvement, community involvement in the future if nothing interrupts the club.
 - Come up with some other ideas we might add, i.e. Scouts merit badge for aviation? others?
 - * City Council Meeting: Start by contact a district rep or their staff; don't just show up ata meeting and blind sell the idea.

Get someone to make a list of district reps and their contacts. Once we get (all) this information gathered, the AMA rep will help us compose a rundown/presentation before we contact them (City Council).

- 2. Field Maintenance. Have we contacted Lance to get the info to set up Google Doc for 2025? May 4th is Maiden day. Schedule field and runway maintenance prior to roller rental to smooth the field. Plan to coordinate the rental of the large size roller to smooth the field. **Caution!** Until the runway is ready, any fliers should exercise caution to avoid the staples, to avoid creating divots in the ground.
- 3. Fire extinguishers in the clubhouse: 3 brought in for inspection. 1 has been recalled, 2 others have expired due to tank age. They are not refillable. Hawkeye extinguishers can offer and service extinguishers @ \$95/year; can purchase new extinguishers for \$50-\$95. Joh Young has provided club extinguishers in the past.
