Club Membership is \$60 annually. The Club requires that members volunteer to help with work projects from time to time. Members must also join the Academy of Model Aeronautics, (the Iowa City Aerohawks are AMA Chapter 824). Flying members must also have a valid FAA UAS Registration Certificate, and must complete the AMA TRUST Certification process. The Club has an active, free instructional program for beginners. Airfield Camera

In the past, a surveillance camera had been installed at the clubhouse, primarily so that members could see if anyone else was at the airfield before driving to the field itself. This camera had fallen into dis-use and has been inoperative for some time. A proposal has been made to the Board that this camera be replaced, and the capability to view the airfield by WiFi be re-initiated. This re-installation and upgrade will incur some up front costs as well as a monthly fee for service.



FLOAT FLY, JUNE 5TH, RIVERSIDE CASINO AREA

The first of three scheduled Float-fly events will occur on June 5th across the street from the Riverside Casino. The event commences about 10:00a.m. and continues as long as interest continues. Normally, those remaining in the early evening adjourn to the Casino for a buffet dinner before returning home. All interested members are encouraged to attend, weather permitting. For those new to the club, or existing club members who have not attended previously, directions are below.



- From Hwy 218, southbound, pass the usual Melrose Avenue exit (Exit #92) and continue southbound for 12 miles, leaving Hwy 218 southbound on exit 80 (Riverside exit).
- At stop, turn left on to Iowa Hwy 22 eastbound, drive under the Hwy 218 overpass approximately 3/4th mile, passing Casey's General Store, through a gentle left and then right curve to the Riverside Casino entrance traffic light (below).
- Turn right into the work area through the open gate, making an immediate left turn to follow the fence eastbound to a gravel road.



• Follow the gravel road around the right turn, and continue to the float fly area. If you pass the float fly area, you will float, rather than fly!
